- 8. To form a local Variety Club with proper membership and expand the yearly show to other areas such as "variety club lunch" with renowned guest speakers.

For all this to happen we need a lot of goodwill and a little extra help in organising ourselves to meet the above objectives. So if you feel you could give a little time and would like to become involved please let us know.

Last years the Theatre Royal Variety Performance donated all monies after costs, which in fact was 6000 euro to the Bowler Hat Musical Drama Productions. This was to help them defray costs on previous productions so that they could get back to what they do best, put on first rate productions. This year we will do likewise for Flaggy Lane Group, who have made us all so proud by winning in terrific style the Waterford International Festival of Light Opera . Remember a huge amount of people get a lot from these groups either by involvement, employment (theatres, musicians etc) or the sheer pleasure of attending their shows.

So tonight we say a huge thank you to all the performers who are here contributing their time, enjoying themselves and spreading a little goodwill. The modern Ireland is a wonderful place but we have got to protect its spirit and not allow it lose its heart. # Filaggy Lane

Since its inception in 2002, Flaggy Lane Productions has undoubtedly become one of the south east's most successful theatre companies to date. Having won the much coveted title of Best Show at the Waterford International Festival of Light Opera for two consecutive years (2005/06) with their much acclaimed productions of Singin' in the Rain and Guys and Dolls, the award-winning society are delighted to be associated with the Theatre Royal Variety Show. It is especially important to us this year as we remember one of Waterford's greatest theatre stalwarts Dermot Graham, whose daughter Vicki's not alone just a core member of our society, but also one of the leading female perfomers in the city and we are delighted she will be leading out special tribute to her father.

Putting on hit shows is undeniably what Flaggy Lane Productions does best. In fact, not alone did the hard-working group win Best Overall Show in the Festival for Singin' in the Rain, they also bagged eight other gongs and went on to be nominated for six Amateur Irish Musical Society (AIMS) awards, the highest number of nominations ever made and in turn they went on to win two of the much sought after accolades.

# Dermot Graham

#### Des Manahan joins in Tribute to The great Dermot Graham

Tonight the Theatre Royal Variety Performance will welcome on the stage the one and only Des Manahan. It's a great pleasure to have him back and it is very fitting that he does so in honour of the memory of Dermot. Many years ago they soldiered together in the "Banks" Tops shows and left us with some great moments to cherish. In tonights show Des will sing "I won't send Roses" from Mac and Mabel and he will also perform as Jacob in a short excerpt from Joseph. Des will be joined by Jamie Beamish who will sing that timeless classic "Send in The Clowns". This song was used by Dermot Graham in the 70's when he opened a crystal show with great innovation and craft. The curtain was raised to what we thought was the back stage crew caught in the act of putting up the set. It took a while to realise that this was intentional and then relax and sigh at the sheer risk of what he had just pulled off. From this the creative Mr. Graham gave us yet another top notch hour of great entertainment.

Another of his favourites was Mac and Mabel which we will feature shortly, the silent movie opening once again had the entire town talking and applying the now yearly plaudits to this wonderful producer. But it was in 1975 that Dermot caused the first "Saipan" of modern Ireland. How! Why! You may ask! It is the year he Produced and Directed "Joseph" for Waterford Crystals entry into John Player Tops. There was controversy up and down the country on whether this show was a variety show or not. The word Variety was bisected and dissected so often that we weren't sure what it meant anymore. Half thought it was variety the others said no way. But what every one agreed upon is that it was a brilliant show.

In the words of CVK writing in the Waterford News and Star, March 21st 1975, "in my experience I have yet to see a production of an all amateur local group which could even remotely compare with the sheer scintillating expertise in presentation of this show" He added that "it was a theatrical triumph" by the phenomenal Dermot Graham. Rumour had it that the impresario Noel Pearson cancelled his professional productions visit to waterford for fear of not matching Dermots production.

Tonight his daughter Vicki will perform in this short visit to those days when her

Dad produced such fine shows. She will be joined by David Flynn as Joseph and the one and only Des Manahan paying respect to an old colleague. In that show in 1975 Dermot left the orchestra pit and sat upon the top step of the old stairs that linked the pit to the stage. There he sang those Canaan days in a perfect French accent. And as Mick Browne wrote in the Munster Express that year...not only did he produce and direct this great show but he then gave one of the most impressive solo performances in it. He said Sean Cotter (the adjudicator) could not find enough superlatives to describe it. So when you hear Des deliver this song tonight remember all those absent friends not with us today. Experience a magic moment in Joseph all those years ago, in the hay day of Tops.

#### Michael Grant

Dermot was a man of many talents, and this was reflected in his varied career. Throughout, he had an abiding passion for music, theatre and working with people. These three passions were given full rein in the 'Tops of the Town'. This competition is legendary in Waterford, which is not surprising given the number of people who were involved with the shows and the bigger numbers who attended and enjoyed the sometimes astonishing levels of talent and entertainment offered. Dermot worked with 'the Glass' for a long time, but also with the Banks and Finance, and the Post Office. His approach was always to give it one hundred percent and to demand that everybody else gave it the same. He was interested in innovation, originality and pushing the boundaries, sometimes even with the rules. This often led to controversy, and on one famous (or infamous) occasion he was 'read off the altar' in one church because of the alleged immodesty of the girls' costumes. Rather than being put off by such incidents, Dermot enjoyed the hullabaloo, and he was often suspected, correctly, of spreading outrageous rumours about the expense Waterford Glass had incurred to put sumptuous productions on stage. This fed the competitive spirit which gave the 'Tops' an added enjoyment and edge, while at the same time it has to be acknowledged that the opposing participants had an abiding respect for each other which was evident in their co-operation in other events, especially those concerned with charities and shows such as tonight's. While Dermot derived enormous pleasure from the shows, he was aware that for many of the participants, it helped develop self-confidence and fostered talent. His aim, in producing a show was, he always asserted, to make those on stage look good. It is fitting that he is remembered for this, and the pleasure and fun that he helped give so many people.


